## New Class B Uniform T-shirts are Here

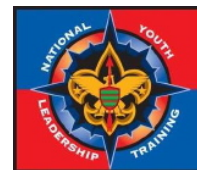

This is your chance to nominate yourself to attend the summer National Youth Leadership Training scheduled for June/July.

This training course is an intensive practical experience in Scoutcraft and Leadership Skills set in a model troop situation. It is intended for mature Scouts who are at least age 13 by the start of the course, and have achieved the First Class rank.

- Weekend #2: July 19<sup>th</sup>, 2008 (Saturday) thru July 21<sup>st</sup>, 2008 (Monday)

The cost to attend either course is \$200.

The meeting was called to order by Committee Chairman, Sue Oki, at 7:30 p.m.

February Parent Meeting notes read. Motion by Lori Wolfe to approve; seconded by Linda Green; unanimously passed.

Alan Carstensen – Treasurer's Report:

- Alan distributed various reports; 3 sources of Troop revenue: fees (dues); program fees, and miscellaneous, courts of honor.
- \$8,700 revenue September 1 through March 11, 2008 (\$3,000 more than originally budgeted due to great recruiting and program fees not established at the time of the budget).
- Every committee has a budget, such as Finance, Activities, Equipment, Administrative.
- It's still very early in the year, so not as cash heavy as it may appear.
- More equipment needed to due successful recruiting.
- Anticipate ending year with higher cash balance than anticipated.

Motion by Lori Wolfe, seconded by Linda Green, to approve the Treasurer's report. Unanimously passed.

Scoutmaster's Report by Kent Screechfield: Scouts need to give one week's notice for a Scoutmaster Conference for advancement. Scoutmasters are happy to explain the process to parents and boys. Other ranks also require a Board of Review in addition to the Scoutmaster Conference. Red scarves are given out during troop meetings; patches are

awarded at a Court of Honor.

Sue distributed a committee structure chart and a list of volunteer roles. These were reviewed.

Ira Hillyer explained FOS. \$175 is the suggested amount, which is what it costs in addition to dues to keep every boy in Scouting. However, any amount is welcome. Our goal is 100% participation at some level. Ira will mail out the pledge cards shortly.

Lori Wolfe reported that advancement information for each boy is maintained on the troop computer. Request a Board of Review through Lori ([advancements@troop805.org](mailto:advancements@troop805.org)).

Linda Green takes care of food at the Courts of Honor. The boys pick the menu and Lori arranges things.

Summer Camp Coordinator is Joan Martin for items such as forms coordination and medical forms.

Alan is the treasurer; fund raising is done by Latha Ramesh and Eileen Chew.

The quartermaster closet is available for used Scout clothing.

Anne Wiedenmann is the Merit Badge Coordinator; there is a small booklet for each badge for the volunteer to follow.

Our seamstress is Mani Peri, who embroiders neckerchiefs.

Shinji maintains our email list and our website.

Please consider helping the Troop in one of the many roles that support our sons. Remember the uniformed leaders and the parent committee is a TEAM (***Together Each Achieves More***).

Contact the Committee Chair if you can help with any of the vacant slots. Sharing duties is also a great way to learn about and support our Troop; if you'd like to assist in one of the positions where we already have an individual assigned please don't hesitate to make it known.

### ADMINISTRATION

- ***Administrative Chair (VACANT)***  
Responsible for coordinating our Parent Committee Administrative positions. Monthly report out at Parent Committee meetings on activities and issues needing full committee input.
- ***Seamstress (Mani Peri)***  
Responsible for making our Troop neckerchief. Includes coordinating patch purchases, and materials for neckerchief – costs all reimbursed by Troop, of course. This tends to be, at most, a twice yearly activity primarily during January/February when we get an influx of new scouts.
- ***School Liaison (Joan Martin)***  
Coordinates with Sycamore Valley Elementary to ensure meeting room reservations are placed in a timely manner. On an annual basis, works with the school identifies a service project suitable for scout participation

that will defray cost of meeting room space. Twice yearly activity – Spring and Summer.

- ***Charter Organization Coordinator (VACANT)***  
Go between on matters that require Charter Organization involvement such as Adult Application processing, 4<sup>th</sup> of July Parade, annual Kiwanis Service Project, ... Twice yearly activities as well as intermittent needs.

### ADVANCEMENT

- ***Advancement Chair (Lori Wolfe)***  
The individual responsible for helping our Eagle Scout prepare their Court of Honor. Duties include coordinating with local dignitaries, obtaining letters of recognitions from government and other organizations, maintaining the Eagle Scout plaque, and generally providing moral support to the Eagle Scout and his family during planning. Can be handled by 1 or 2 individuals as a team. Frequency of activities limited to when Eagle Scout rank awarded to a scout.
- ***Eagle Court Liaison(s) (Barbara Miyao, Barbara Valdriz)***  
The individual responsible for helping our Eagle Scout prepare their Court of Honor. Duties include coordinating with local dignitaries, obtaining letters of recognitions from government and other organizations, maintaining the Eagle Scout plaque, and generally providing moral support to the Eagle Scout and his family during planning. Can be handled by 1 or 2 individuals as a team. Frequency of activities limited to when Eagle Scout rank awarded to a scout.
- ***Court of Honor Coordinator (VACANT)***  
Assists Advancement Chair with publishing the Court of Honor program. Computer skills needed. Quarterly activities prior to the Court of Honor.
- ***Database Mgr. (Marlene Foster)***  
Responsible for the maintenance and support of the Troop database

(Troopmaster). Works to merge/distribute satellite databases to Advancement and Merit Badge Coordinator, and provided reports to Scoutmaster and Committee Chair as needed. Minimum of quarterly activity occasionally monthly duties included.

- ***Hospitality (Lynda Green)***  
Coordinates refreshments for Court of Honor or other social events. A minimum of quarterly activities.

### EQUIPMENT

- ***T-Shirt Salesperson (Donna Church)***  
A resource for the sale of the Troop T-shirts. Duties involve researching and coordinating T-shirt manufacture, and being available to the Troop membership for T-shirt orders and distribution. The Troop is currently looking to upgrade the Troop T-shirt to a non-wicking material so may require an initial period of activity beyond what would normally be expected.
- ***Quartermaster Aid (VACANT)***  
Helps the adult quartermaster in maintaining the Troop equipment. Varied level of activity.

### ACTIVITIES

- ***Summer Camp Coordinator (Joan Martin)***  
Serves as a single point of contact for all the paperwork necessary for scouts and adults attending Summer Camp (medical forms, shooting sports permission slips, etc.) and compiles same for the adults in charge. Additionally, keeps a tally of payments made by scouts/adults and coordinates deposits with the treasurer.
- ***Medical Coordinator (Joan Martin)***  
Maintains the Troop First Aid kits and responsible for collecting medical forms and coordinating with the Database Mgr. to maintain Troop records of the same. Involvement varies but likely limited to quarterly tasks.



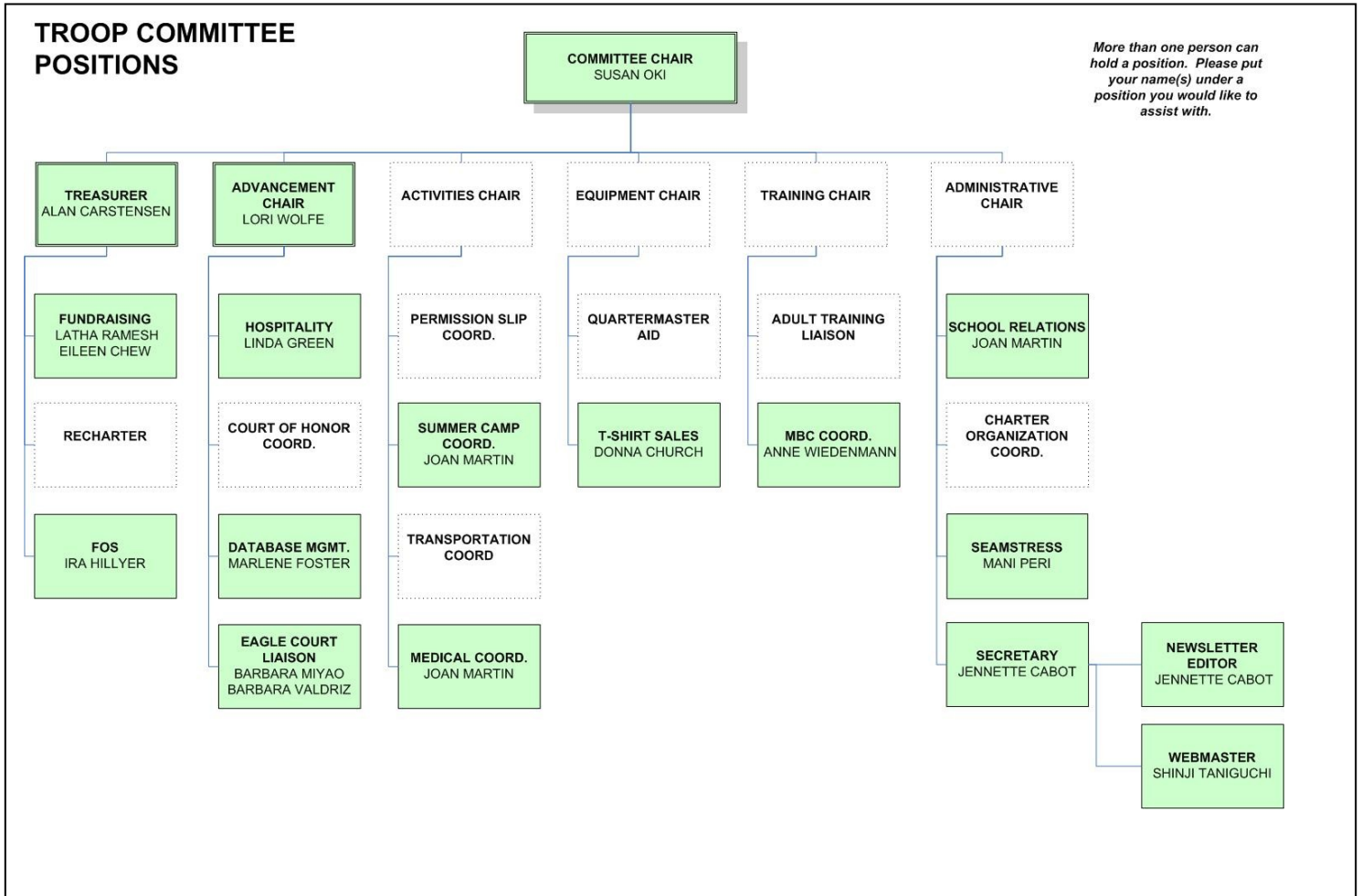
- **Transportation Coordinator (VACANT)**  
Coordinates driver for outings. Works with the outing adult leadership to ensure there are sufficient drivers, etc for any outing. Could be handled by multiple people. Possible assistance in obtaining Tour Permits from council could also be needed. A monthly activity.
- **Permission Slip (VACANT)**  
Assists uniformed Leaders in authoring permissions slips in a timely manner. Provided permission slips to webmaster for publication. A monthly activity.
- **Secretary (Jennette Cabot)**  
Aids the Committee Chair by

maintaining the minutes of the parent committee meetings. Works with the Newsletter Editor to include minutes in the “Troop Tidings”. A once a month responsibility.

- **Webmaster (Shinji Taniguchi)**  
In charge of maintaining the Troop website. This job primarily involves publishing documents provided by other Troop members (permission slips, newsletter, calendar ...) on a monthly basis. Also includes the maintenance of the Troop email distribution lists and forwarding addresses.
- **Newsletter Editor (Jennette Cabot)**  
Responsible for producing the monthly Newsletter from articles provided by adult leadership, scouts and parent committee. Computer skills a must. Monthly activity.

## TRAINING

- **Merit Badge Councilor Coordinator (Anne Wiedenmann)**  
Maintains the MBC lists for the Troop and coordinates the addition of councilor’s with the District Advancement Chair. Varied low level activity.
- **Adult Training Liaison (VACANT)**  
Responsible for tracking adult training needs and alerting the Scoutmaster and Committee Chair of needs. Varied low level activity.
